The plastic voting card must be returned at the end of the voting day or a fee of \$100 per card will be invoiced to councils. Electronic handsets will be distributed from the Albury Theatre foyer and a demonstration of the cards and electronic handsets will be given before voting on motions begins. Lanyards will also identify those who are voting delegates.
