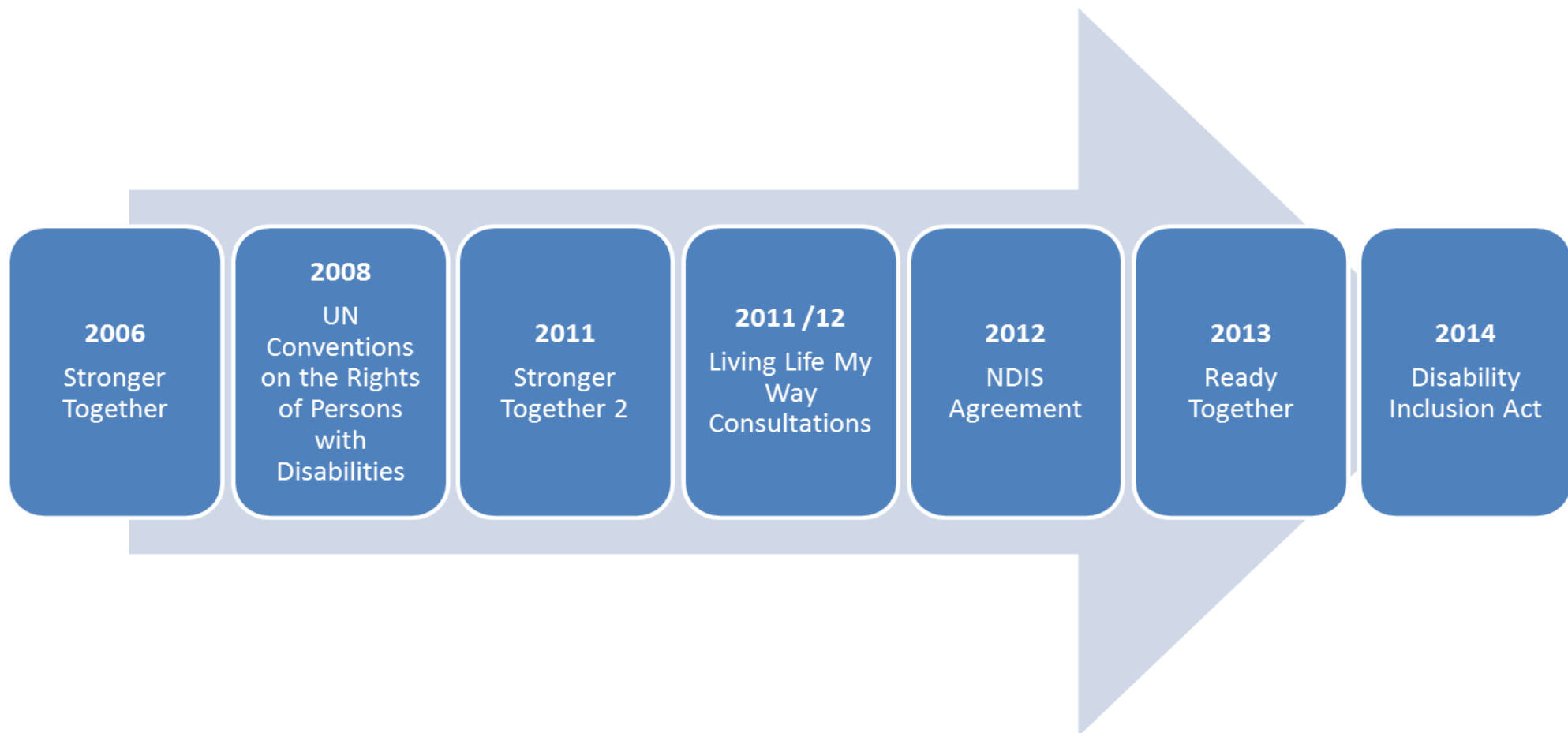




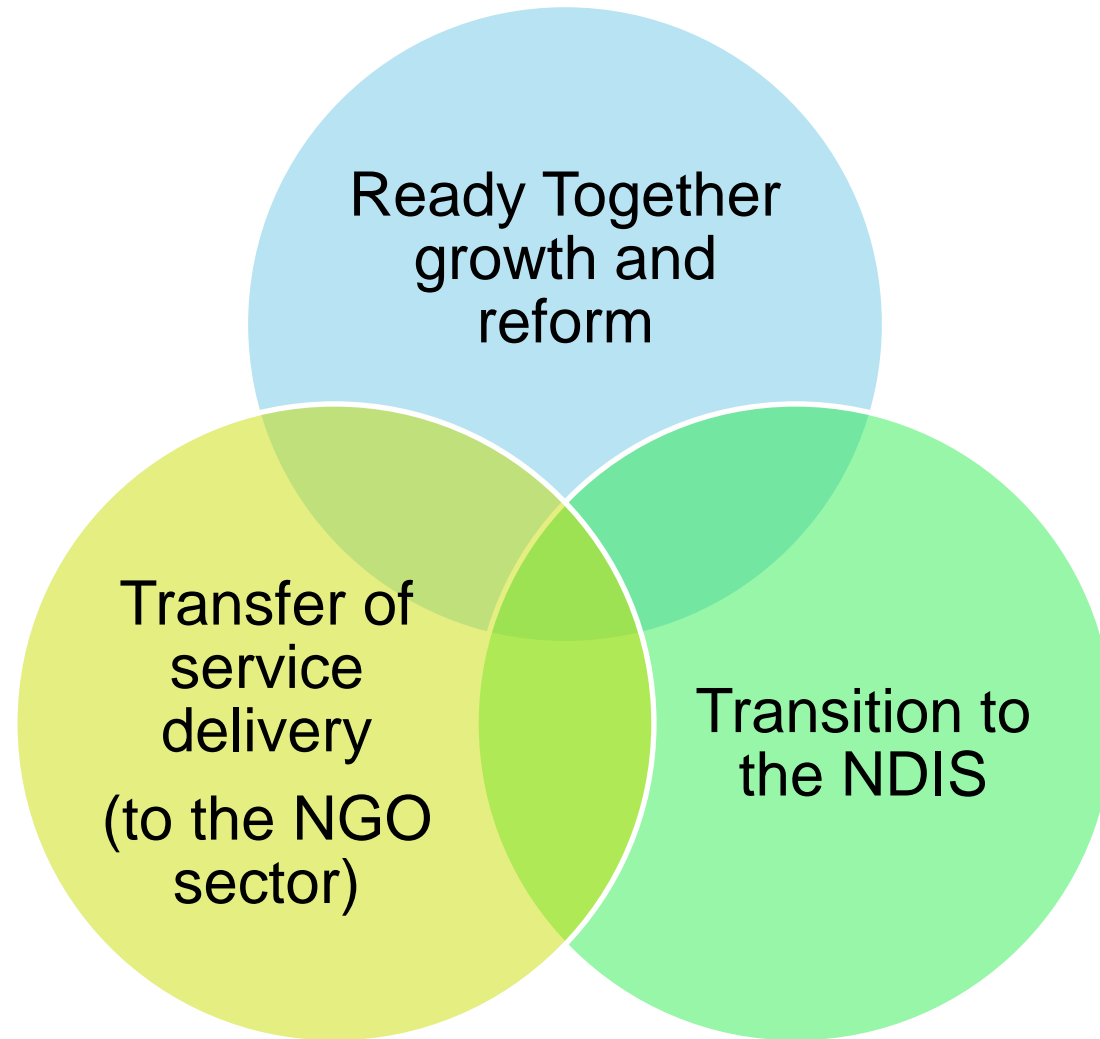

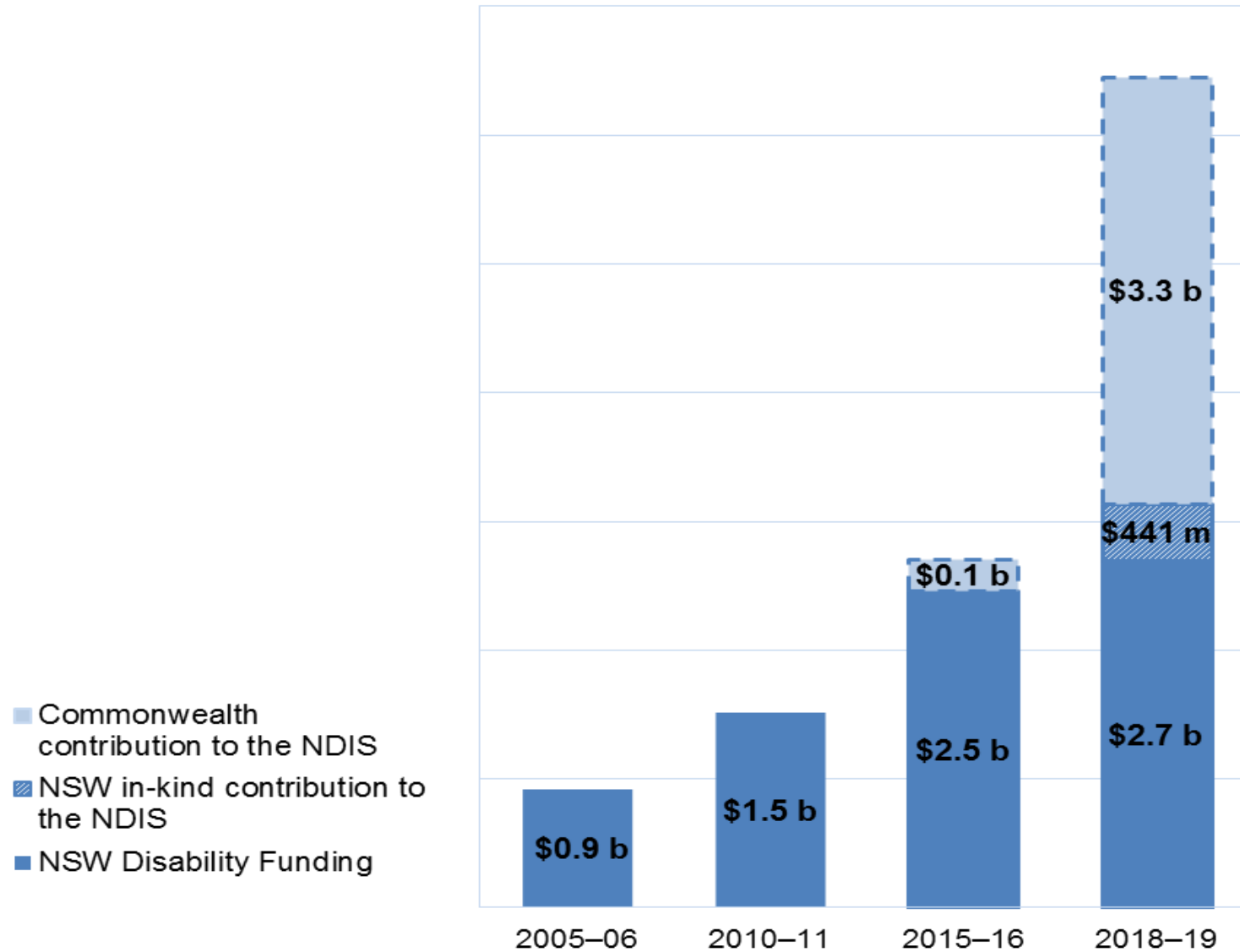
## Time of change for the NSW disability sector

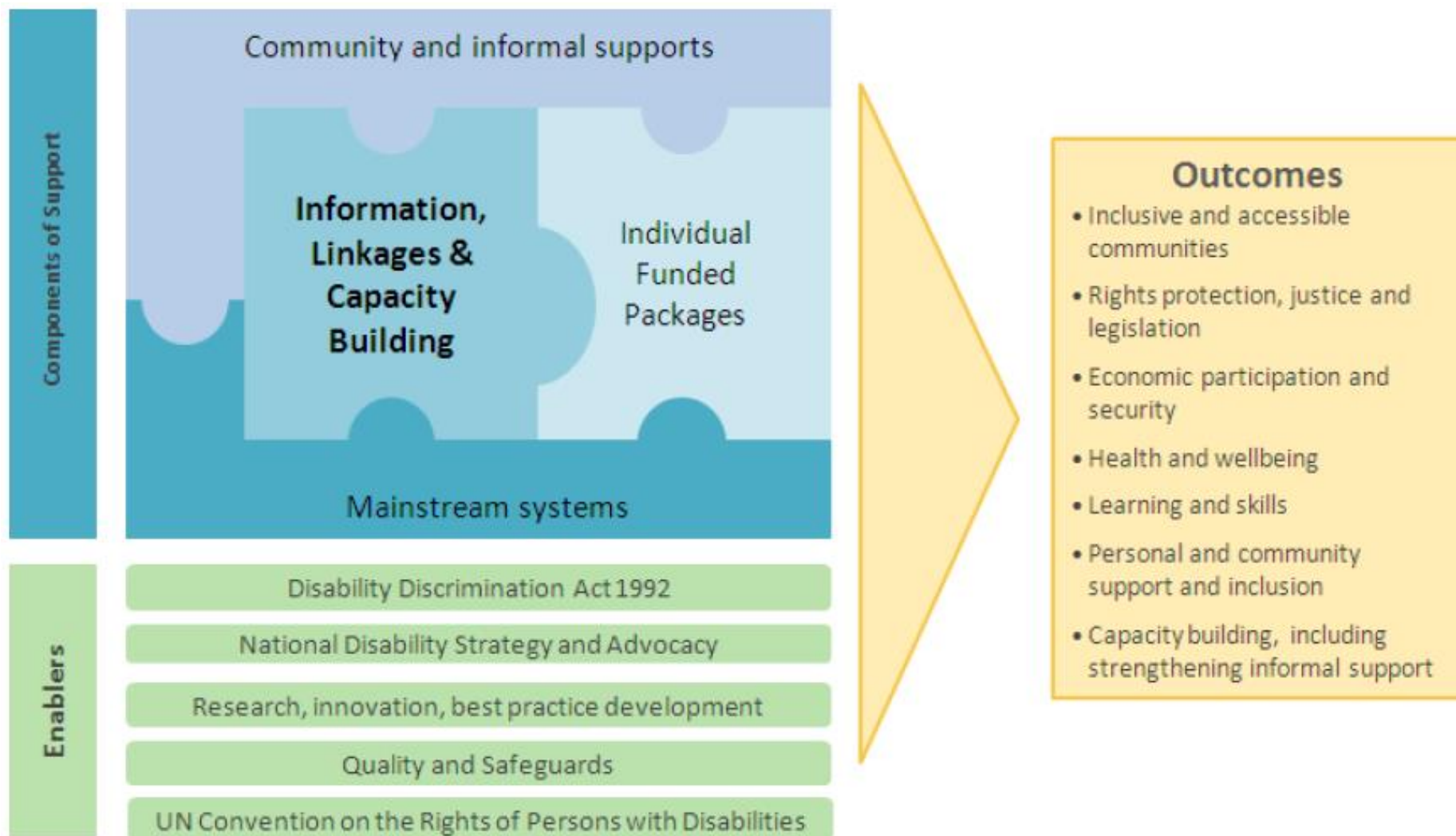


# NDIS national Trial Sites

# Information, Linkages & Capacity Building (ILC)

ILC builds community inclusion through five streams of activity:

- Information, Linkages and Referrals
- Capacity building for mainstream services
- Community awareness and capacity building
- Individual capacity building
- Local area coordination

# Community Care and Support Program

- New funding agreements for the period 1 July 2015 to 30 June 2018 are now being issued.
- These funding agreements cover the proportion of your services that support people with a disability under the age of 65 (under 50 years for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people).
- Funding for the period beyond 1 July 2016 is dependent upon NDIS transition arrangements to be agreed with the Commonwealth Government.
- More detail on NDIS transition arrangements is expected to be available later this year.
