

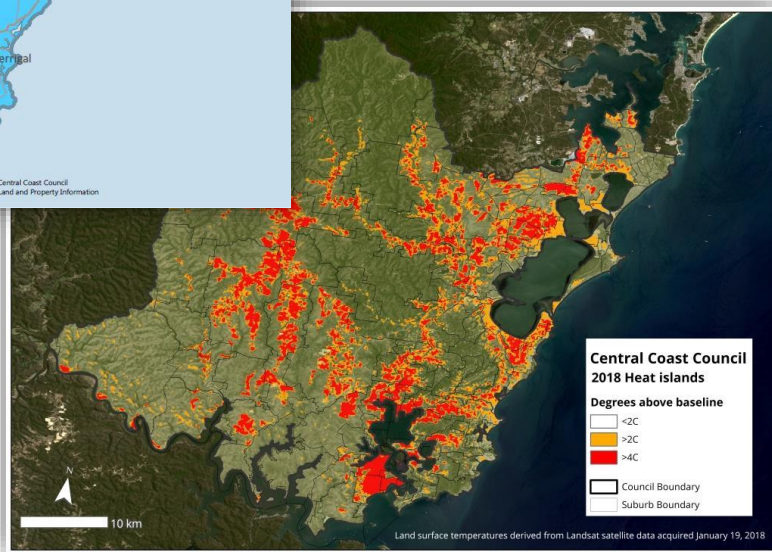

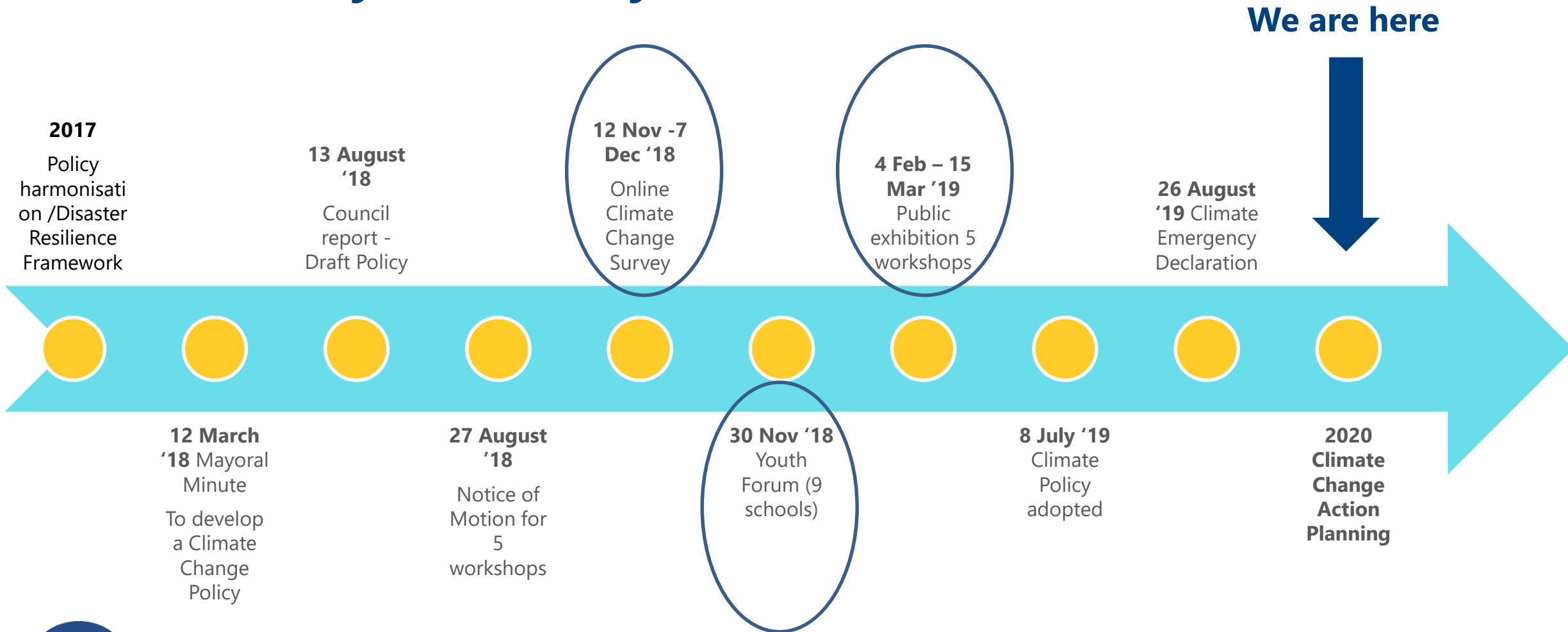

The Policy Journey



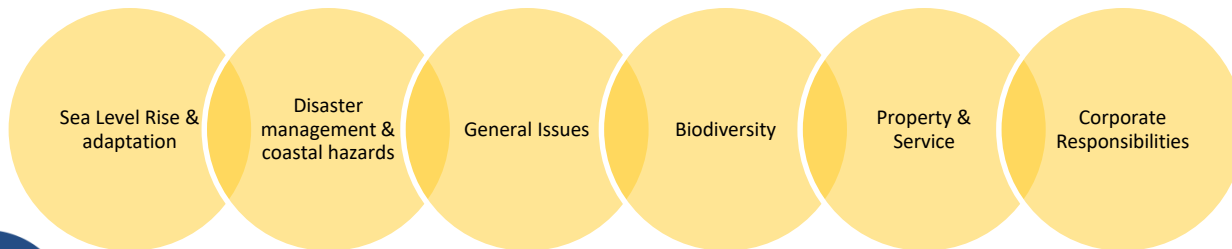
Engagement Plan

- 6 workshops themes



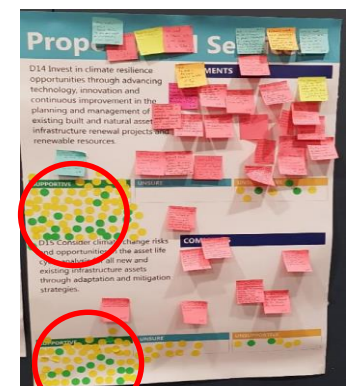
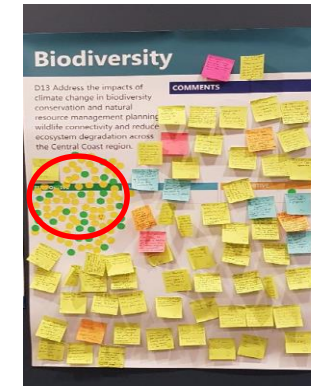
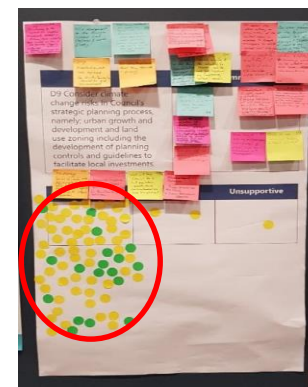
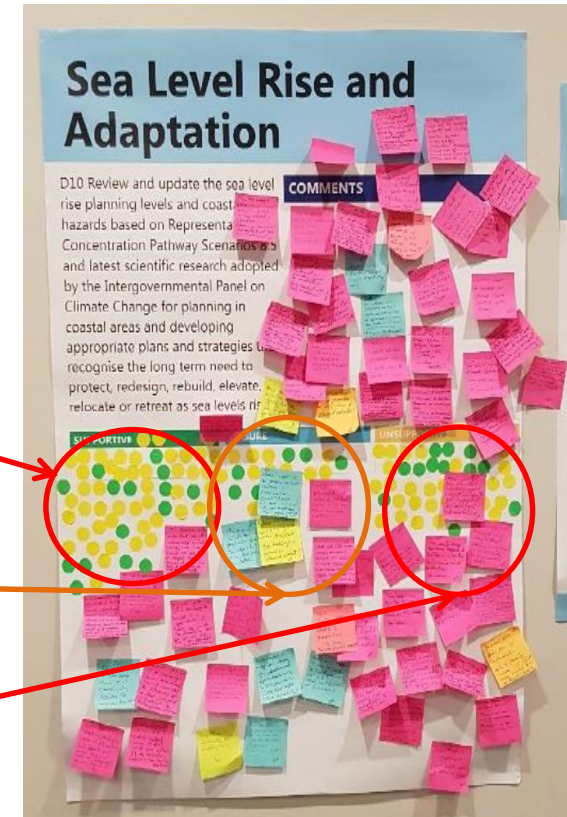
Engagement Process
