

Outcomes



Outcomes: Raised Community Awareness

Promotion of Clean up Service

- 152% more residents use their council clean up service
- 100% of residents surveyed knew dumping was illegal and how to dispose of household items correctly

Internal partners

- "My Street is Your Street" reached 95,750 people
- Residents requested more street gardens
- 32% more residents felt empowered to report a dumper
- 83% increase in public reports of dumping



Outcomes: Established Partnerships

Long term partners

- Engaged with 347 businesses & 36 others
- Property Manager Working Group continues to grow
- Tied in "Get Rid of it Right "campaign to Council events

Internal partners

- Officers received POEO Act training and shadowed RID officers
- Developed simple clean up notice, other resources and training
- Ongoing support for community gardens to deter dumping

An invoice for the fee will be mailed to you along with a copy of this notice. It is an offence not to pay this fee. You can apply for an extension of time to pay the fee or for the fee to be waived. In this case, Council has waived the administration fee.

Clean-up Notices HOW TOS



Delegation

Be sure you are a delegated "Appropriate Regulatory Authority" to issue a clean-up notice. You must have the power of s91 of POEO Act.

? Reasonable suspicion:

Be sure that you have reasonable suspicion that indicates a pollution incident has potentially occurred. Record the circumstances by:

- · taking and storing photos,
- · recording notes in your field note book,
- · taking and storing samples, and/or
- · any other appropriate method

Admission: If the person admits the act, document this and have them acknowledge this (via signature)

Clean-up Notice:

Allow recipient to comment on the Clean-up Notice that you've drafted. Make any changes.

· Identify pollution incident (in Dictionary).

For dumped rubbish, this means that there must be, or that there is likely to be, land pollution as defined in the ROFO Act:

- (a) that causes or is likely to cause degradation of the land, resulting in actual or potential harm to the health or safety of human beings, animals or other terrestrial life or ecosystems, or actual or potential loss or property damage, that is not trivial, or
- (b) that is of a prescribed nature, description or class or that does not comply with any standard prescribed in respect of that matter,
- State the type of clean-up action that you are directing the person to do and the day/time you
 expect clean-up action to be completed
- Decide on whether you will charge an administration fee. This is discretionary. It applies in cases
 where there are large dumps or repeat offenders.
- . Give the recipient the Clean-Up Notice, and take the carbon copy to council for processing.

Enforcement:

When an offender fails to comply with the clean-up notice, you can take enforcement action. The penalty amount is \$4000 for an individual and \$8000 for a corporation.

Outcomes: Boosting Enforcement

- 49% reduction of illegal dumping incidents at hotspot streets
- → All illegal dumping incidents were recorded in RID online
- → 50% increase in ranger enforcement patrols
- → 12% of investigations received a clean up notice or warning
- → 8 RID Squad "Project Jacobs" were delivered
