#### Green Globe Awards recognise the Roadside Vegetation Implementation Project

## Court decision on retaining hollow-bearing dead trees as habitat

Holroyd Council had a win in the Land and Environment Court recently in relation to retaining hollow-bearing dead trees as habitat. The <u>judgment</u> establishes useful case law.

#### **NSW Government**

#### **Crown Lands Report**

The NSW Government has released their Response to Crown Lands Legislation White Paper, Summary of Issues and Government Response, October 2015.

The report includes clarification that there will be no forced transfer of land to councils, an assurance that the Act will explicitly recognise the need to integrate environmental, social, cultural heritage and economic considerations in decision-making about Crown land, and a commitment to reduce red tape.

#### State-wide review of pest animal management

The Natural Resources Commission is undertaking a review of pest animal management in NSW across all land tenures for environmental, economic and social benefits. As a part of its review, the Commission has released an <u>issues paper</u> that identifies the priority issues and opportunities for pest animal management in NSW.

Feedback on the issues paper will assist the Commission in developing a draft recommendations report (in early 2016). The Commission will also undertake public consultation on the draft report, and regional tours will take place throughout the review to gather information on on-ground issues. A final report, including outcomes of public consultation, will be provided by the end of June 2016.

### Invitation to join Flying-fox Land Managers' Network

OEH is establishing a network for land managers across NSW dealing with flying-fox camp management. The network will share knowledge, experience, ideas, research, skills and lessons learnt in managing flying-fox camps. It will also serve as a support base, discussion forum and resource hub for land managers with flying-fox camps including contentious camps. Council staff involved in flying-fox issues are a key target audience for this discussion group. Other members may include: state agencies, public authorities, NRM groups and Local Land Services. #### **Australian Government**

The Department of the Environment has released its <u>Referral guideline</u> for management actions in greyheaded and spectacled flying-fox camps.

This guideline provides greater certainty to proponents on whether or not they need to seek approval for management actions at camps of the grey-headed and spectacled flying-fox. It provides guidance on mitigation measures that should be used to avoid significant impacts on these species and hence the need for referral under the EPBC Act. This guideline has been developed in collaboration with state and local government agencies across the range of the two flying-fox species, species experts and the general public. It aligns with state government legislation and policies to maximise regulatory streamlining while upholding strong environmental standards.

Local Land Services has extended the consultation period for the draft <u>State NSW Travelling Stock</u> <u>Reserve (TSR) Planning Framework</u> until 4 December 2015. ### Australian attitudes to climate change and adaptation report

The <u>report</u> presents the findings of a longitudinal survey of Australians from 2010 to 2014. Conducted annually in July and August of each year, the CSIRO surveyed a total of 17,493 Australians. The surveys form part of a research program investigating the ways in which Australians think about climate change, and the activities they are undertaking to mitigate or adapt to its impacts.
